

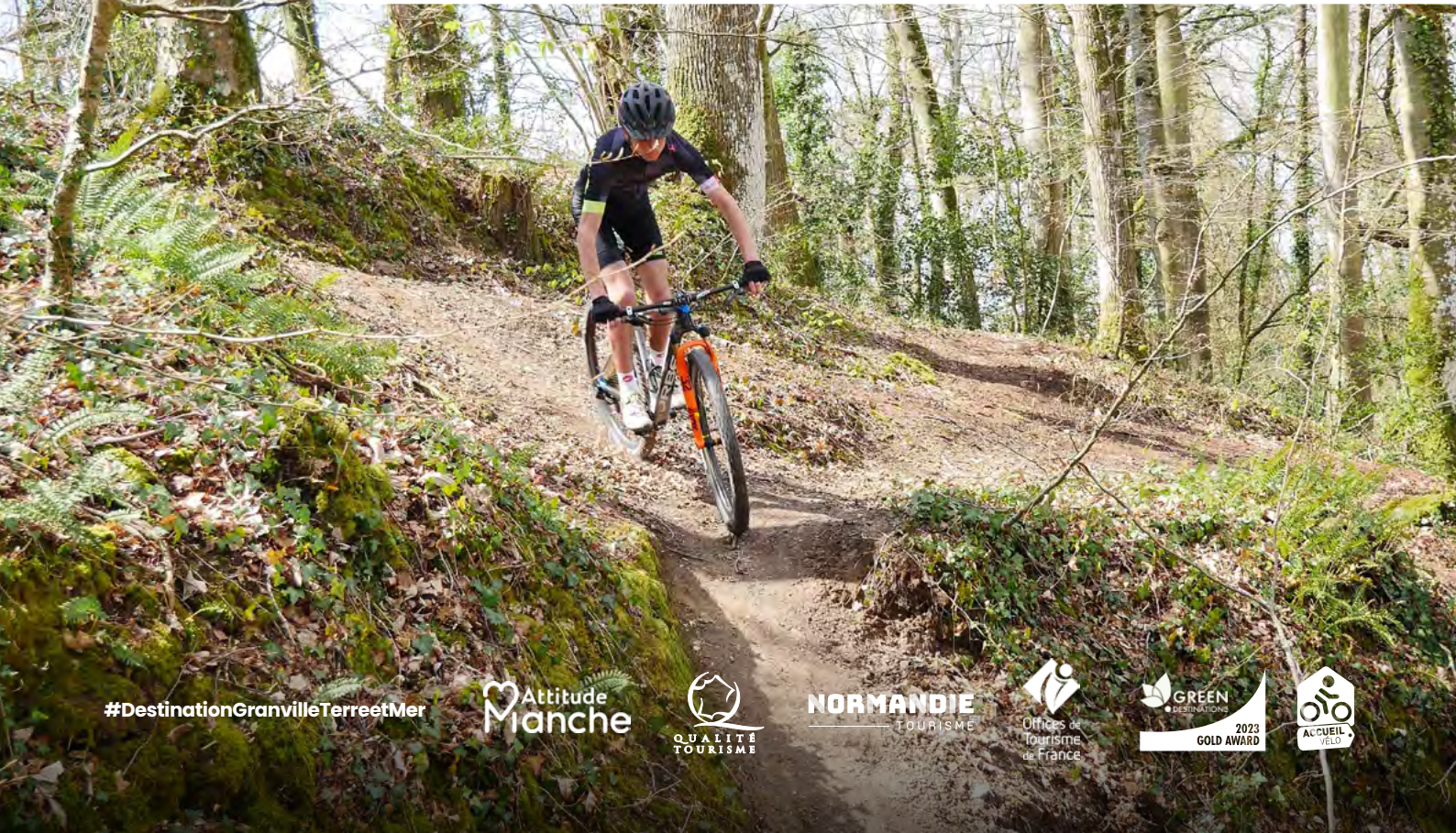

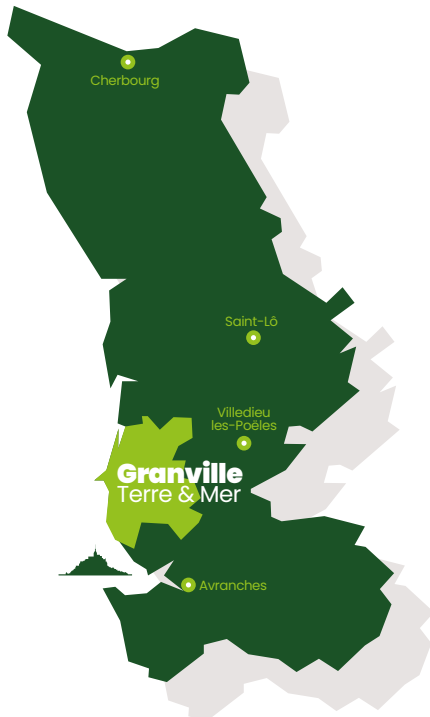

Granville Terre et Mer is keen to share the secrets to the delights it offers to travellers and residents alike, while also taking care to respect its well-preserved natural and cultural treasures.

Granville Terre et Mer's aim is to create an **attractive, balanced** and **mutually supportive region**.

As a result, Granville Terre et Mer is **awarded gold by Green Destinations**: 3 out of the 5 steps towards GTSC [Global Sustainable Tourism Council] certification have been achieved.

Granville Terre et Mer was assessed through over 100 socio-economic, environmental and cultural criteria, and in September 2023 received international recognition for its efforts to promote a type of tourism which is sustainable for people, nature and the climate.

Let's leave a positive impact together

Have you heard of Equinox: Manchois-style hospitality? The destination strives to provide you with unforgettable experiences, while keeping the Manchois* spirit alive. To preserve the hypnotic charm of our land over the long term, the destination recommends behaving in an environmentally friendly way. This is a meaningful joint commitment between the locals and visitors, based on sharing and understanding the land and mutual respect, to make sure the destination leaves a lasting impression on everyone.

#1 Opt for soft mobility to recharge those batteries

Granville and Folligny are served by train. The NOMAD coach network operates routes across the Manche region, while the NEVA urban bus network serves 6 towns and villages in Granville Terre et Mer all year round: Donville-Bains, Granville, Yquelon, La Haye-Pesnel, Cérences and St-Pair-sur-Mer. The region also boasts 700 km of trails (footpaths, cycle paths, mountain bike trails and bridleways).

#2 Don't invite the gulls to dinner!

Herring gulls like coming into town to find their food away from the danger of predators. Some local residents may find these opportunistic birds – which are, after all, free to fly wherever they please – a real nuisance. Not feeding them helps improve visitor/local – and bird – relations!

#3 When it comes to aperitif time, you can't beat local!

Whelks from the Bay of Granville have a Protected Geographical Indication (PGI) and are the perfect product to accompany your aperitif. Add some regional smoked salmon, prawns, goat's cheese, sheep's cheese, chitterling sausage and oysters to your whelks for a delicious aperitif platter to enjoy with a glass of local beer or cider.

#4 Picnic in the great outdoors with zero waste, of course!

In Granville Terre et Mer, there are 3 very important colours to remember: yellow for basic recycling / grey for household waste / green for glass. For a zero waste picnic, use reusable cutlery and containers. Bring your own water bottle to remain hydrated. Sorting waste is the starting point for a new life through recycling.

#5 Take on the water conservation challenge!

A shower in just 4 minutes? Game on! Drinking water is becoming increasingly scarce in France, and Granville Terre et Mer is no exception, especially in summer. You can, however, do your bit to help save water by being careful with your water consumption when using showers, toilets and sinks, and just generally in your household or holiday accommodation. To find out more, visit the SMPGA website (Syndicat de Mutualisation de l'eau Potable du Granvillais et de l'Avranchin).

#6 Collecting seafood at low tide? Be careful not to overload your basket!

The foreshore in Granville Terre et Mer is home to a vast variety of shellfish, including cockles, clams, oysters, mussels, prawns and more. If you're going to go collecting seafood at low tide, you'll need to make sure you use the right equipment, be careful with how you collect and handle the shellfish and ensure you don't overstep the mark on authorised sizes and quotas.

#7 Top up your tan... in the countryside!

Granville Terre et Mer boasts both sea and 'bocage' (wooded countryside). It is not just the region's fine sandy beaches that are good for catching those summer rays! Enjoy the sunshine on the grassy pastures of the protected natural site of Havre de la Vanlée, in the fields away from the coast, along paths that criss-cross local villages, from the 'bocage' to the salt marshes... There is so much to explore and discover in the green oasis that is Granville Terre et Mer.

#8 Collect happy memories (but not plants!)

From La lande des Cent Vergées to the cliffs of Carolles and Champeaux, the dunes of Bréville-sur-Mer, the Chausey archipelago and the Airou basin, the local area has protected coastal areas and a preserved rural hinterland which deserve our careful attention.

#9 Visit out of season and enjoy a different side to the region

Tranquillity, recharging your batteries and saving money are just some of the many advantages of opting for a break in Granville Terre et Mer outside of school holidays and bank holidays. It's also the perfect time for the locals to take the time to help visitors discover the region's hidden treasures. To be shared far and wide, for a successful holiday all round!

**Locals of the Manche department*

1. Highlights in the local area

le Havre de la Vanlée

With its samphire, dunes and salt meadow sheep, Havre* de la Vanlée is one of the 8 tidal inlets in the Manche department, and more specifically on the Côte des Havres, which is a unique feature in France. It extends over an area of 10 hectares. This tidal inlet is a paradise for nature lovers, with a rich variety of flora and fauna. Around 150 bird species have been recorded here. When the tidal coefficient reaches 90 and beyond, the road crossing Havre de la Vanlée, which allows locals from Bricqueville to get to the beach, can become submerged and disappear under the sea. The marshes then become a new playground for watersports enthusiasts and thrill-seekers.

+ Experience

EXPLORE HAVRE DE LA VANLÉE BY KAYAK AT HIGH TIDE

(Duration: 2 hours, dates depend on tidal range)



Set off to the 'end of the world' at high tide with Cédric or Gaël from the Nautical base in Saint-Martin de Bréhal (8 milles nautic). Explore one of the department's 8 tidal inlets by kayak and enjoy a combination of sport, tranquillity and wonder.

The 3 highlights of this experience

- Having Havre de la Vanlée all to yourself!
- Enjoying some peace and tranquillity, helping to you to recentre.
- Crossing the still submerged road with Cédric or Gaël



Showing respect for the stunning scenery of the salt marshes surrounding you means you will be able to enjoy it freely for the many years to come. It also means complying with the parking rules and leaving your car in the designated areas.

The Haute-Ville **de Granville**



The Haute Ville or upper town in Granville is the historic district. Here, you will find legendary buildings such as the Grand'Porte, the Maison du Guet, Notre-Dame du Cap-Lihou church and the theatre. The ever-changing, serene light that bathes the area also imbues the streets and alleys of this charming district. Sea views can be enjoyed from both sides of the ramparts. Rue Camberton is the lively heart of the Haute Ville, with its famous bar, 'La Rafale',

where Granville residents and tourists alike can enjoy a drink.

Rue Notre Dame leads to the square in front of Notre-Dame du Cap Lihou church. The church is dedicated to the men and women who work at sea. You can walk along the Pointe du Roc as far as the Cap Lihou lighthouse, an iconic landmark for seafarers.

Here, you can enjoy uninterrupted views as far as the Pointe de Carolles.



La Vallée **du Lude**

Nestling between two high cliffs, the Vallée du Lude is a site of untamed nature teeming with wildlife and protected since 1973. The Lude stream meanders through the valley before flowing across the pebble beach and into the sea at Le Lude harbour. This valley is said to have been opened by a sword stroke from the Archangel Saint Michael. There are also two 'circuits des Peintres' (Painters' Routes) where you can wander around this open-air museum of paintings.



Explore Mont Saint-Michel Bay in a new way.
Try the 'classic' or more unusual quicksand

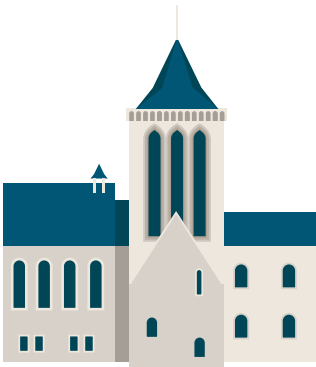
Vauban **Cabins**

There are three of these in our region. You can take a break for a moment while walking along the coastal path near the Vauban cabins at Carolles and Champeaux. These small stone lookouts in Mont Saint-Michel Bay were built on the edge of the cliffs and were used to observe the movements of enemy ships during the First Empire. The third cabin, which has been recently restored, is located not far from the Chemin du Corps de Garde (coastal path) on the hillside above Jullouville.

1. Highlights in the local area

Lucerne Abbey

Founded in 1143, Lucerne Abbey is a unique example of medieval Premonstratensian architecture, one of the few such complete examples in France. The abbey underwent a remarkable maintenance and renovation project that spanned 50 years. The architecture of this complex tells a compelling story of intimacy and strength, and the history of men who lived by what they believed in. The pure and minimalistic style of this type of architecture, the stunning luminosity and the preserved authenticity of the site are striking. You can visit it at your own leisure or be accompanied by a guide.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE TO CARVING STONE

*(Duration : 1 hour 30 minutes,
dates available on the online events calendar)*



Step back in time and learn to carve stone as it was practised in the Middle Ages at Lucerne Abbey. After a fun guided tour of the abbey, follow the expert advice given by Julie and practise creating a design inspired by the abbey using the same tools and processes as our ancestors. You can then take your creation home with you!

The 3 highlights of this experience

- Becoming a builder of bygone days for a day!
- Immersing yourself in the secrets of the abbey
- Creating a Holy Grail to take home.

Dior Museum and garden

The villa 'Les Rhumbs' is set in the heart of the garden. It was once the couturier's birthplace and is now a museum. This is where the famous couturier Christian Dior took his first steps. The museum enables you to learn about the world of Christian Dior through his works and his family history. Each year, a new themed exhibition is devoted to him, with an average of 70 dresses on show. The garden has incredible views of the sea, the famous Plat-Gousset promenade and the Chausey archipelago. You can breathe in the scent of the sea and roses in spring.

APPRENTICE PERFUMER AT DIOR

Learn about the art of bottling inspired by Christian Dior's creations in the childhood home of the famous designer. Discover the notes of your own fragrance in the old reading room in Villa Les Rhumbs!

1. Highlights in the local area

Chausey

The Chausey archipelago is one of Granville's island districts, with 365 islands and islets at low tide and 52 at high tide, and the highest tidal range (difference between high and low tide) in Europe. Chausey is a precious gem that must be preserved and respected. Each lagoon and each rock has a name and is home to exceptional fauna and flora. Stroll around this protected area where nature reigns supreme, away from the hubbub and crowds, and immerse yourself in unspoilt countryside. Only the Grande Île can be visited and it takes 2 hours to 2 hours 30 minutes to walk around it.



On the Grande Île, open fires and wild camping are prohibited (you're not on a desert island); keep hold of your dog as you would the helm of your boat; pay just as much care and attention to taking your rubbish away with you as you do the shells you've collected, and stay on the footpaths while you're out exploring.

AN ARTY EXPERIENCE ON CHAUSEY

(duration: full day - 5 hrs
on the Grande Île of Chausey)



Maud will take you on an exploration of Chausey as you draw a dozen or so landscapes of the archipelago using an ink brush on a watercolour background.

The 3 highlights of this experience

- Explore the Grande Île from a different angle, whether it's your first time here or not.
- Leave with a dozen or so landscape views you've created yourself.
- Learn how to use Chinese ink.



Le Château de **Chanteloup**

Château de Chanteloup has belonged to the de Thézy family for nearly three centuries. A visit to the château takes you back to different periods in history, from the Hundred Years' War to the Wars of Religion and the Revolution. The château is part of an estate which includes a cider museum, an animal park and a shop selling local and regional products, where you can also taste and buy the cider products made on site. In 2023, Louis de Thézy was awarded the Prix d'Excellence for his 5-year-old pommeau by the French Ministry of Agriculture and Food Sovereignty.

2. A holiday that suits you

For one day

- Visit the **Christian Dior museum** and garden.
- **Sample local produce** in one of Granville's restaurants.
- Take part in a **guided tour of the Haute-Ville** (QR code page visites guidées).
- **Head to Pointe du Roc** for a breath of sea air.
- Console yourself when thinking about having to leave by enjoying a sweet treat in one of **Granville's tea rooms** : Picorette, La Marquise des Presles or Dame Gourmande.



For a week-end

- Go and see the exhibition at the **Museum of Modern Art**.
- Stroll along the **ramparts of the Haute-Ville**.
- Enjoy a walk along the harbour and **sample some seafood** in one of the traditional restaurants.
- Visit an **artist's gallery**. →
- Explore **Lucerne Abbey** (tip: take advantage of the guided tour included in the entrance ticket if you arrive by 10.30 am - except on Sunday mornings and during religious festivals).
- Walk the **Vallée du Lude** and the **Vauban cabin** loop and catch a glimpse of **Mont-Saint-Michel** in its bay.



For a week

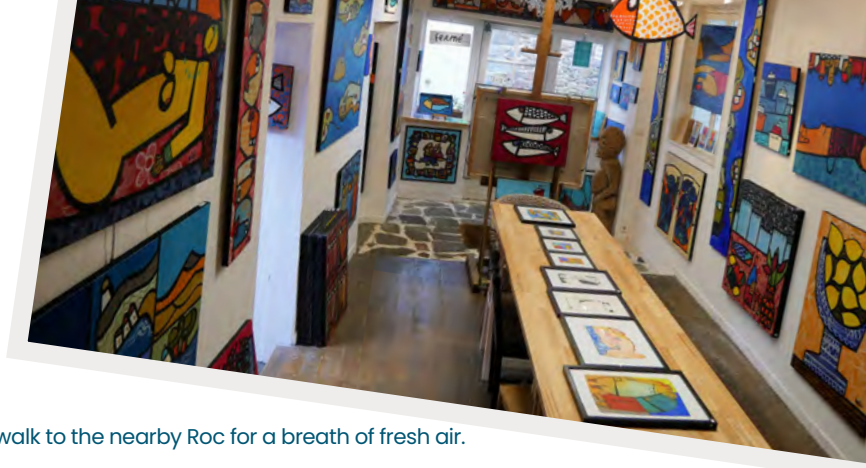
- Set off on a day's adventure aboard an **old sailing ship** to the **Chausey archipelago** or with Franck Voidie's 'Balade Gourmande'. →
- Enjoy a **romantic stroll** along one of the local area's various promenades while watching the sun set.
- Visit **Château de Chanteloup** and its Cider Museum.
- Go on a tour of the **local markets**.
- **Lunch at the La Passerelle** restaurant and marvel at the tide that covers the submersible road at high tide in the **Havre de la Vanlée**.
- Relax at the **Thalasso Prévithal** spa in Donville-les-Bains.
- Set off on a 'so British' day trip to **Jersey**. ←
- Take part in **one of the unique tours** offered by the Tourist Office which → combine either creativity and gastronomy, or arts and crafts and gastronomy.
- Go and see a show at the **Archipel theatre in Granville**.



You are A family

For one day

- Go and see **the Roc des Curiosités** and walk to the nearby Roc for a breath of fresh air.
- Eat in a **crêperie in the Haute-Ville**.
- Take **a stroll along one of the beaches** in the local area and enjoy an ice cream before heading home : Saint-Martin de Bréhal, Coudeville-sur-Mer, Donville-les-Bains, Saint-Pair-sur-Mer, Jullouville or Carolles.



For a week-end

- Conduct one or more **detective investigations** to explore the region in a fun and entertaining way.
- Enjoy a **picnic in the peace and quiet of the Val-Es-Flours** park, with its playground and small animal park.
- **Admire Mont-Saint-Michel from the Vauban cabin** in Carolles before heading to the "Rêver Réalité" equestrian park for an introduction to circus acrobatics or simply to pet the park's animals.
- Watch goats being milked at **the Chèvre Rit educational farm** from Wednesday to Saturday evening from 5.30 pm in Granville.



For a week

- **A day trip to Chausey** with the Jolie France shuttle, including a picnic (the bag for rubbish is in the rucksack). Take part in the **workshops offered by the Christian Dior Museum** and the Museum of Modern Art.
 - Go on a tour of **Château de Chanteloup** with a costumed guide to experience the site's 1,000 years of history.
 - Take part in one of the **guided tours for children** offered by the Tourist Office.
 - Visit the **Domaine d'Esthine donkey farm** in Carolles to find out all about the donkeys of the Cotentin region.
 - **Go back in time at Lucerne Abbey** in a fun way with the Norman abbeys family pack, or by attending one of its workshops (consult the online events calendar to find out about the various dates), find out all about the Viking attacks on the abbeys with guide Simon Tasset. (Tip: Admission to Lucerne Abbey includes admission to Pirou Castle, a real 12th-century medieval fortress, at a reduced price. It is located 50 km north of Lucerne Abbey).
- ← Learn about **good practices for collecting seafood on foot** during high tides, so you can enjoy the seafood afterwards.
- Explore the **hedged farmland** along short hiking trails.
 - Challenge the whole family at **Green Mini-Golf** in Saint-Aubin-des-Préaux or Mini-Golf du Thar at Kairon beach.

A group of friends

For one day

- Explore Granville using the **'Granville et son Roc' walking trail**.
- **Enjoy a climbing session together at Freedôm**, a recreational venue in an iconic location in Granville.
- **Explore Granville, the Haute-Ville and Granville-Chausey bay** on a sailboat for 8 people from the 8 Milles Nautic base in Granville. Get an introduction to navigation on this sailboat with our passionate instructors.



For a week-end

- Travel north to south (or vice versa) along the **GR223**: leave from Champeaux or Bricqueville-sur-mer and follow the customs path, Stop off in Granville and spend the night on the water's edge, at the 8 Milles Nautic accommodation.
- **Book the panoramic apartment for a breathtaking view** of the bay at the 8 Milles Nautic base and then after a hearty breakfast, set off on an introductory catamaran sailing trip.
- Spend an evening with your toes at the water's edge in one of **area's beach cafés**.
- **Dance the night away** at Le Purple.

For a week

- **Participate in a cosmetics workshop** at Anthémis Cosmétique at the Château de Chanteloup.
- Go **sand yachting** on the long sandy beaches at Saint-Martin de Bréhal or Jullouville.
- **Cross Mont-Saint-Michel Bay with a qualified guide**, inspired by the age-old custom of pilgrims walking to Mont-Saint-Michel.
- Go to the end of the world in **Havre de la Vanlée** and/or paddle or kayak in the Havre de la Vanlée during high tides.
- **Order delicious pizzas** from the Atelier Pizza and eat them on the beach at Donville-les-Bains after **enjoying your last swim of the day**, no matter the tide thanks to the saltwater swimming pool.
- Enjoy a fun day out **exploring the local area's various hiking trails** and search for caches using the free geocaching app.
- Battle it out **playing board games at the shop 'A ton Tour'** or during a laser game at 'Boules et Billes'.
- Buy **The Game box at one** of our Tourist Information Offices and set off through the streets of Carolles to solve the mystery.



You are Without a car



For one day



- Take a self-guided tour of **Granville's Haute-Ville** and its fishing port and perhaps **watch the fishermen landing their catch**.
- Explore the **Christian Dior Museum** and the **Richard Anacréon Museum of Modern Art** (tip: if you buy a full-price ticket for one of the museums, the other will be at a reduced price).



For a week-end



- Take a look at the Granville market on Saturday morning and grab a bite to eat. Learn about traditional **sailing on trips into Granville Bay on La Granvillaise** →
- Take the Néva route No 2 to the coastal towns of **Donville-les-Bains and/or Saint-Pair-sur-Mer**, where you can wander around and enjoy the two hiking trails that start there: 'Les Balcons en Herbe' and 'Le Petit Quéronnais'.
- Enjoy the pleasant, **musical atmosphere in the evening at Granville's 'La Rafale' bar** in the heart of the Haute-Ville.
- Buy **The Game box** at one of our Tourist Information Offices and embark on a thrilling investigation through the streets of the Haute-Ville.



For a week



- Take the Nomad bus No. 308 out of season or the Néva No. 5 in season to Jullouville and **visit the three Vauban cabins** on the Sentier des Douaniers (located in the communes of Jullouville, Carolles and Champeaux).
- Take the Nomad bus No. 308 from the stop nearest to your accommodation to **the Mont-Saint-Michel** car park (please note: this bus makes a daily return trip to the Mont-Saint-Michel shuttle bus park between May and September, and then every weekend and public holiday) and explore the Marvel on Mont-Saint-Michel and its abbey. *Tip: buy skip-the-line tickets, available from our tourist information offices.*
- **Hire a bike** and complete one of the loops included on the Z-card
- Experience **the thrills of catamaran sailing** at the nautical base (8 milles nautic) of Granville.
- Hire bikes in Granville and set off to **explore the Bricqueville-sur-Mer salt meadows**, the birds and little huts there. Stop by the 8 Milles Nautic base in Bréhal for an introduction to wingfoil. A thrilling experience guaranteed!
- **Hop aboard the Charles-Marie**, an old trawler reconverted into a traditional sailboat, and set off on a cruise to Jersey, then come back the next day via the Chausey islands.



Forget the hassle of parking, say goodbye to stops at the petrol pump, take your time (and stop wasting it)... treat yourself to unique adventures full of unexpected twists and turns to give you plenty of excitement.



3. Come and experience the high tides

We are lucky to have 42 km of coastline in the Granville Terre et Mer local area! It is the ideal destination for those who love the sea to try out new sports accessible to all, or simply to admire the open sea.

OUR TOP 5 things to do

- 1. Try your hand at wing foiling at Bréville-sur-Mer**
Learn to fly like Aladdin by trying out wing foiling, the latest watersport. It's a cross between surfing, windsurfing, stand-up paddleboarding and kitesurfing.

Experiencing high tides

The Granville Terre et Mer area is home to the biggest tidal range in Europe! The tides are an extraordinary phenomenon of nature and are always a fascinating sight to behold. Sometimes you have to walk a long way to get to the water's edge, depending on the tidal range, i.e. the difference in water height between high and low tide. The higher the tidal

range, the greater the difference between the rise and fall of the sea within a 6-hour period. The tide is caused by the combined effect of the gravitational forces of the Sun and Moon and the Earth's rotation. Autumn is the best time to take advantage of the high tides, and it's a great time to collect seafood at low tide with your family or friends.



Coef 116 : It's time to slow down and take a deep breath by searching out quiet spots on foot, or by bike. Time to go fishing for information, before going fishing on foot.

3..Experience the high tides

Collecting seafood at low tide

Accessible to all, it combines usefulness with pleasure. To ensure that it remains a sustainable pleasure for years to come, it is essential to comply with the regulations to be certain that you only catch the authorised species and sizes in accordance with the time of year and in respect of their breeding cycles. To fish responsibly, fish using only your fingers and eyes, which means no fishing gear.



The only motto for a day's fishing is responsible fishing!

In the end, what's the difference between a good fisherman and a bad one?



The emergency number for sea rescue is 196.

Before setting of

- Check the cleanliness of the areas where you want to collect seafood at low tide.
- Check the times and the heights of the tides. You need a minimum tidal range of 80 and to be on location 1hour 30 minutes before low tide.
- Check the weather forecast and, if fishing alone, inform another person when you intend to be back.

While Fishing

- Respect the fishing and consumption restrictions.
- Respect the size, quantity and seasonality of the shellfish to be harvested.
- Keep an eye on the tide and head back 45 minutes after low tide to make sure you don't get caught out.
- Only collect what you need. Do not overfish.
- Make sure you put back any rocks you've lifted to respect biodiversity.

- Don't pick up shellfish that are dead, cracked or have a suspicious smell.

- Don't touch professional equipment.

After fishing

- Soak the shellfish to remove the sand.
- Quickly put them in the fridge.
- Preferably eat them the same day.

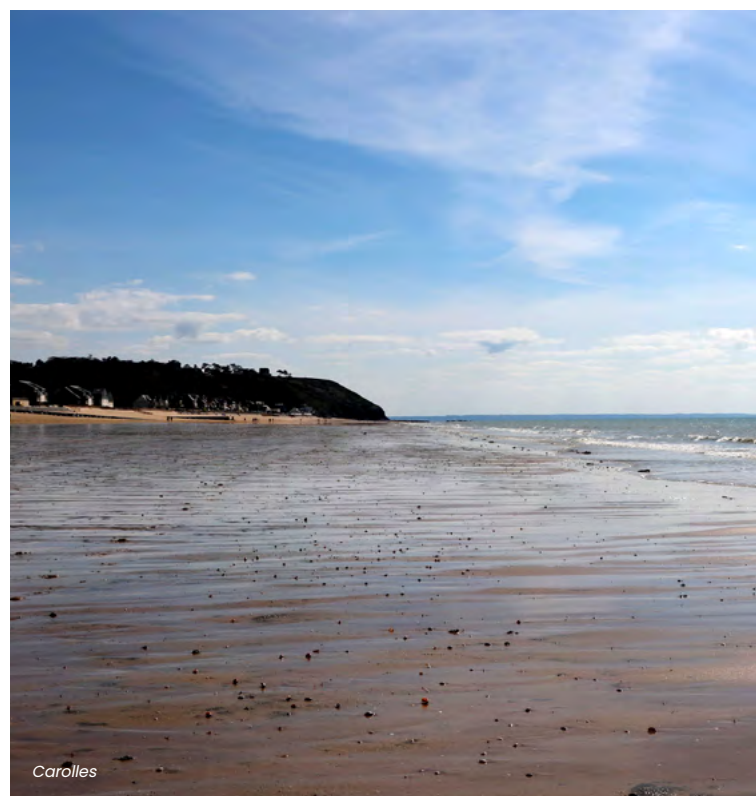

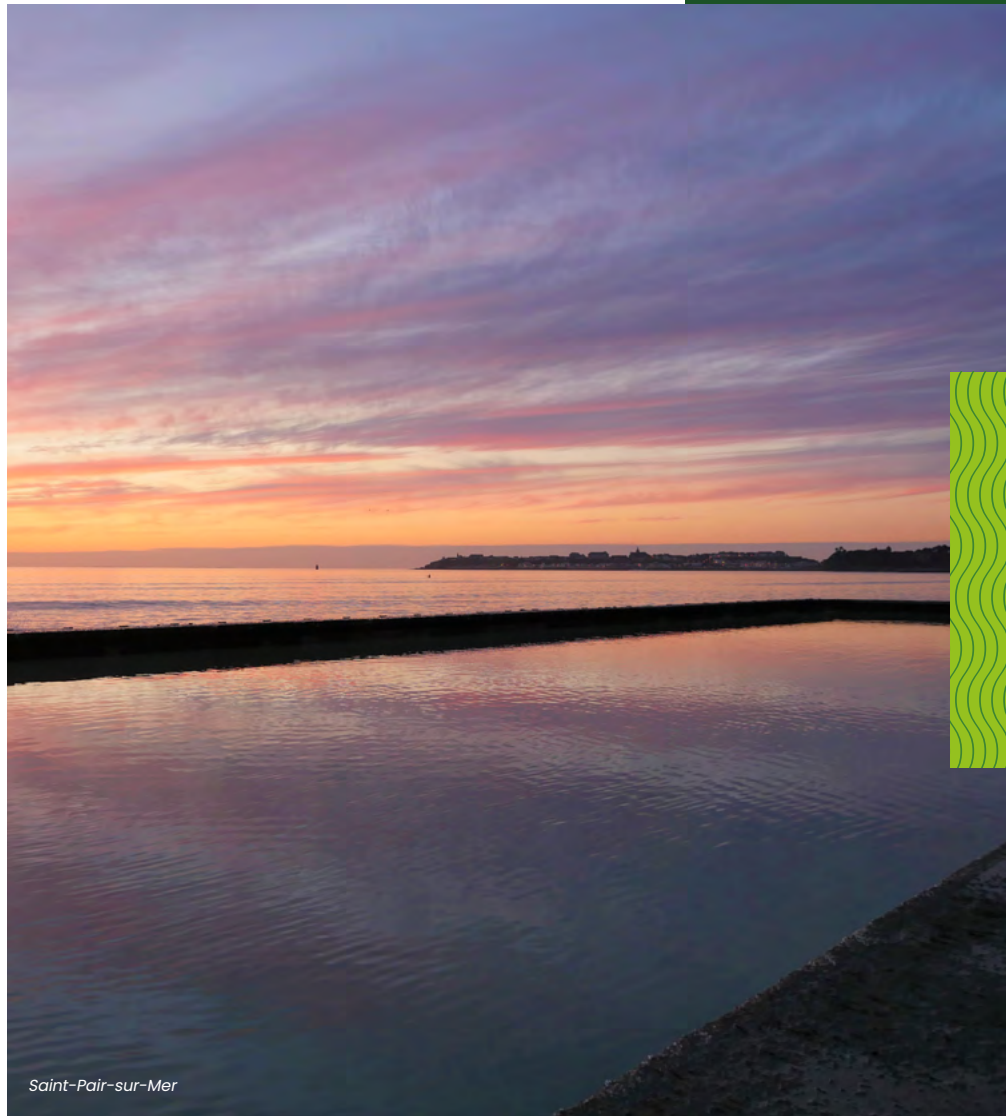

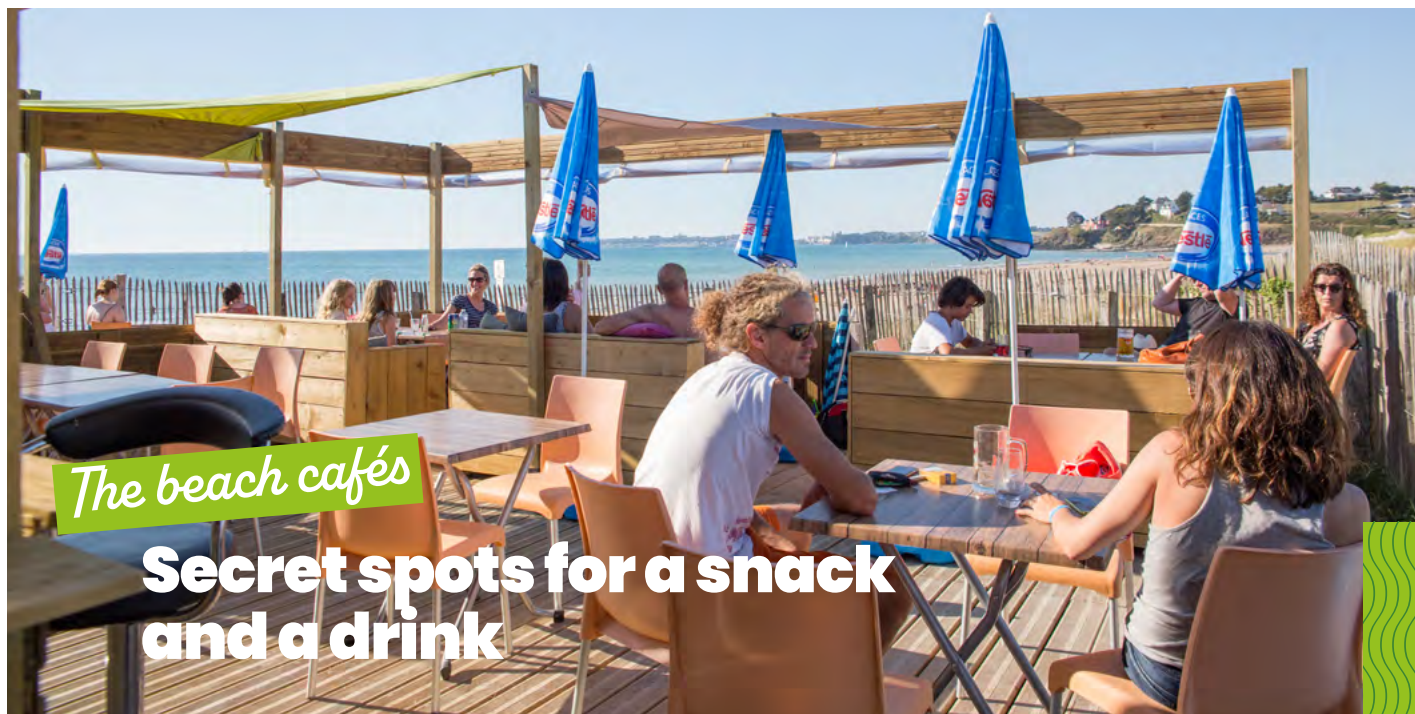

Les Halles, Granville's covered market

The covered market on Rue Ernest Lefranc was opened on 17 and 18 July 1936. Les Halles very quickly became a venue for entertainment such as the opening ball of the Carnival. Boxing matches were also organised there regularly.

The building is now listed as '20th century heritage'.

In August 1944, the indoor market became a makeshift hospital where wounded soldiers were treated. Convalescing American soldiers sketched Disney characters on the walls. These drawings were covered during renovation work in the 1980s. A few were uncovered in 2019 and will still be visible.

from the Domaine M. Le Girard cider farm

Please briefly introduce yourself.

I planted my first apple trees at Coudeville-sur-Mer 16 years ago. I previously worked in other areas in Seine-Maritime, first in banking and then in real estate. In 2020, I completed a year's training at the 'Le Robillard' agricultural college in Saint-Pierre-sur-Dives. I come from a family of farmers, so I'm going back to my roots in a way.

What type of products do you offer?

I make cider, apple juice, perry and pommeau. I sell all the regional Normandy drinks, with the exception of Calvados. Everything is organic with no added sulphites. This is a great attraction for visitors looking for traditional Normandy products.

I sell my products mainly direct from the farm. You can also find them at the Biocoop in Granville. I also supply restaurants such as the Ibis hotel 'Le Hérel' and 'Le Relais des îles' in Coudeville-sur-Mer.

Tours of the cidery are also available on request for anyone who is interested. It works very well, and I've already been able to welcome up to 40 people. Visitors really enjoy learning about the different stages in my process.

What is it that makes you stand out?

I believe apples have an extraordinary richness of flavour. All the different types of flavour can be found in apples, and the production technique used helps to bring them out. The cows graze under the apple trees and help to enrich the soil naturally, so I don't use any

fertilisers. I've also encouraged swallows to nest as they feed on insects and so naturally protect my apple trees. As a result, I don't use any insecticides. I let the apples ripen in the grass once they have fallen so that they can develop their full flavour. They are then harvested by hand to avoid damaging them.

Do you have any tips for enjoying cider?

With its 4 percent alcohol content, cider is perfect as an aperitif, and its fruitiness and acidity make it ideal for tasting.

It also goes very well with meats, cheeses and, of course, apple tart!

Mélanie Malle

Chez Selene, a shop with so many surprises in store.

Come and meet Mélanie Malle, the owner of Chez Selene, a wine bar on Rue des Juifs in Granville.

Can you tell us a bit about yourself?

I'm originally from Normandy, I was born in Vire. I studied at the hospitality school in Granville and then I started doing seasonal work at luxury hotels in Courchevel and in the south of France. After that, I went to London to work on my English. I had planned to stay there for 6 months but ended up staying for 6 years. That's where I really learnt everything I know about the profession. I climbed the ladder one step at a time and worked in various fine dining establishments and Michelin-starred restaurants. Then I came back to France, to Paris, where I helped open a dozen restaurants in my role as Head of Operations and sommelier. After that, I went to New Zealand for a year. When I came back, the plan was to open my own business. I wanted to leave Paris and so it was only natural that I would come back to my home region, and to Granville in particular, where I had spotted a gap in the market. I opened my business in December 2022 on Rue des Juifs.

Can you explain the concept of your business to us?

It's an ever-changing concept. Originally, I wanted to open a wine cellar and move slightly away from the restaurant concept and the associated working hours. I therefore started out as a wine merchant and wine bar for a few hours in the evening. Then, when demand for a selection of food started to grow, I decided to get back in the kitchen. So now my business is a wine

bar, wine merchant and I also offer a food menu. I also organise outdoor events, I supply some local restaurants with wine and I sometimes help Sarah Herpin on some of her catering jobs. I love the collaborative side of the catering industry, when different sectors work together. Recently, I was lucky to be featured in 'Le Fooding' and the 'Gault & Millau' guide, which is a fantastic reward for all the hard work throughout my first year.

What products do you use?

All the wines I sell are natural, biodynamic or from sustainable farming practices. They are 'clean' and quality wines. I pick up the products I use from the market or local shops such as local cheese producers, oysters from Lenoir-Thomas and bread from the 'Les Champs Libres' bakery nearby. I don't need big quantities so it's easier for me to do my shopping myself. I decide on the menus depending on my inspiration and the seasons. My menu features around 7 or 8 sharing platters to choose from with organic and local products wherever possible, some vegetarian options and seafood. I also make a lot of things myself. I make my own pickles and I recently went out to collect wild garlic to make homemade pesto for my 'croc'. I love cooking! I also have a wide range of wines available by the glass, including sparkling, red and white wines and the selection changes every week. I also propose picnic hampers that are presented in fishing baskets. My customers can call me the day before and I prepare everything for them including the picnic blankets and serviettes (all fabric),

cutlery and glasses. Nothing is throwaway of course! Everything is homemade, from the hummus to the sandwiches, banh-mi and the desserts are from the 'Les Champs Libres' bakery.

I am also asked to organise special wine-tasting evenings from time to time and it's something I'm thinking about developing for the next chapter.

8. Walking in the great outdoors

There are 700 kilometres of hiking trails, including the famous GR®223, for both budding and experienced hikers, as well as those who enjoy family walks. Whether on foot, by bike or on horseback, the possibilities are endless. Go exploring at your own pace: our local area has something for everyone.

Observe, feel and listen to your surroundings on short walking routes that are easy to do with children, or on more challenging trails for the more experienced. For those who love steep trails, experienced mountain bikers and keen hikers will be in for a great taste of freedom.

Three books are available to buy at our tourist offices :

- **The 'family' guidebook** with its 19 routes ranging from 3 to 8 km for short, fairly easy walks, is designed for those who enjoy strolling and discovering nature in all its simplicity. €6
- **The 'expert' guidebook** with 20 physically challenging itineraries ranging from 10 to 30 km for mountain bikers and keen hikers. €6

Andrea and her Norman Cob, Caporal, will take you on a horse and carriage ride between land and sea to unveil all the secrets of this destination.

The 3 highlights of this experience:

- A chance to discover the world of the horse and carriage and the Norman Cob breed.
- You'll be taken along the GR223 trail inland in a horse and carriage and then enjoy a peaceful lunch with local products up on the Carolles cliffs.
- Caporal will lead you across the vast stretches of sand between Jullouville and Kairon and maybe even through the waves for some refreshing splashes, depending on the weather.



The major walking routes

Granville Terre et Mer, in the heart of the Mont Saint-Michel Bay, is home to a network of major routes which wind their way along paths, through villages and along the coastline.



GR®223, Sentier des Douaniers (the customs officers' trail) on foot

The GR®223 is the coastal path that runs from the Seine estuary at Honfleur (Calvados) to Mont-Saint-Michel (Manche). It has outstanding views of the local area, with its cliffs, dunes, beaches and harbours :

- GR®223 – **Northern section** , from Bricqueville-sur-Mer to Granville **(17,5 km)**
- GR®223 – **Southern section** , from Granville to the cliffs at Champeaux **(20 km)**

Les chemins du Mont-Saint-Michel à pied

The 'Barfleur – Mont-Saint-Michel' path passes through the Granville Terre et Mer region :

- Section : **Coutances / Cérences (23 km)**
- Section : **Cérences / La Haye Pesnel (22 km)**
- Section : **La Haye-Pesnel / Saint-Jean-le-Thomas (25 km)**



The path along the cliffs can be steep and vertiginous at times. Be careful.

The recommended coastal route

Work is in progress on the coastal route from Carolles to Donville-les-Bains. This enables you to take advantage of a number of dedicated cycle paths. The route from Muneville-sur-Mer to Champeaux is 37 km long (see the tourist map).

Please note: Only sections of the route are complete, which means that it does not yet run the entire length of the coastline. The completed sections are not currently signposted.

Bike hire companies

Once you are equipped, you can enjoy the recommended routes and different trails which will enable you to explore the local area. There is something for everyone with coastal and countryside trails.

Did you know ?

If you're a first-time cyclist, the 30-40km sections are suitable for people in average physical condition. If you're travelling with children, start with short sections of 15-25 km per day. Choose the sections according to the pace you wish to set yourself.

← **NOMAD regional transport**

Regional buses run all year round in the local area: Route 305 from Lison to Granville, route 307 from Avranches to Granville direct, and route 308 from Granville to Mont-Saint-Michel via the coast. You can find prices and the timetable at www.nomand.normandie.fr



← **The Néva inter-communal bus network (free)**

Néva buses run 6 days a week, Monday to Saturday, all year round.

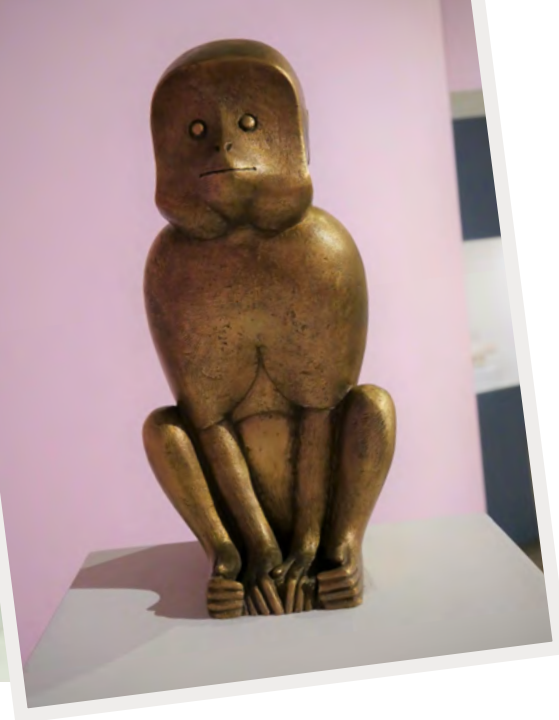

There are many buildings that testify to the richness of the local history and heritage, whether hidden away along a narrow dirt track or perched proudly on the cliff tops. Some are nothing more than ruins while others have been protected from the ravages of time, but all will tell you about their past and their place in the overall story of the area's history. Come and discover the old buildings of Granville Terre et Mer!

'Old buildings' TOP 10

Granville Terre et Mer's rich architectural heritage means that there is something for everyone interested in history and buildings. However, just in case you don't know where to start, here are our Top 10 must-see old buildings in the local area!



1.

The 'Cabane Vauban' in Carolles

This small guardhouse perched on the Pointe de Champeaux is one of the last surviving reminders of the French coastal defence system designed by Vauban at the end of the 17th century. Despite being 300 years old, it remains virtually untouched and offers incredible views over the whole of the Mont Saint-Michel Bay. A marvellous structure in itself, it overlooks the Marvel!

2.

Lucerne Abbey

Founded in 1143 by Richard de Subigny, bishop of Avranches, the monastic complex at Lucerne has been the focus of a major restoration project over the past 60 years. This was initiated by Abbé Marcel Lelégard, a great lover of ecclesiastical built heritage. Today, it is an outstanding historic and architectural site tucked away in the depths of the Thar Valley.



The Ramparts and the Grand' Porte

Granville, a key fortified town in the Duchy of Normandy and later in the Kingdom of France, owed its reputation to the thickness and robustness of its walls and its great gate (Grande Porte). The gate is now fully open and provides a superb point from which to start exploring the Haute Ville (upper town). A stroll along the ramparts will take you back in time and allow you to follow in the footsteps of the shipowners from Granville.

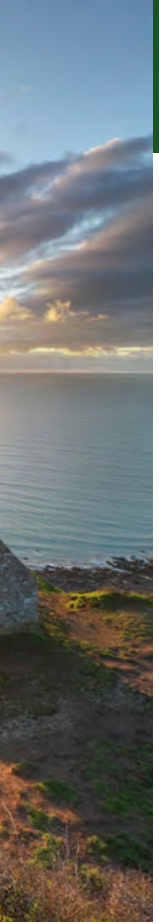

Notre-Dame-Cap-Lihou Church, Granville

Notre-Dame church, which stands on the site of a former wooden chapel, has a highly eclectic architectural style due to the 340 years it took to build! Despite this, Notre-Dame possesses an overall aesthetic harmony which enhances its beauty, and its interior decoration adds to the building's unique character.





The village of Les Blainvillais, Chausey

This little hamlet, located in a cove sheltered from the wind, was built in the early 19th century to accommodate the inhabitants of Blainville. They crossed the sea every summer to work with the local kelp and extract lye. This industry no longer exists today, but the village remains, and it fits in perfectly with the archipelago's picturesque setting.



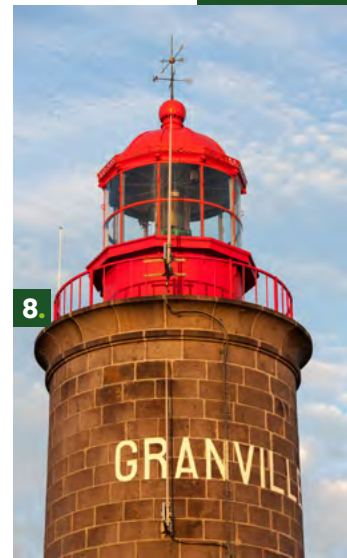
Château de Chanteloup

The castle's oldest parts date back to the 11th century and more than 1,000 years of history have passed through its old walls! Today it is in the process of being restored, but you can still enjoy guided or self-guided tours to find out more about its past, and its natural setting adds to its charm. The quality of the cider, which is produced close to the site and sold on the premises, should also be mentioned.



La Maison du Guet, Granville

Although the youngest building in the Top 10 (dating back only to 1905), the Maison du Guet (Watchtower House) has become a landmark in the town thanks to its neo-medieval architectural style with touches of fantasy. So much so, in fact, that this house is now often referred to as a 'Granville style' house... even though it is the only one which looks like this!



The Lighthouses

The Granville and Chausey lighthouses are quite austere in appearance but are included in this Top 10 because of the key role they have played in the town's maritime history. Their construction at the beginning of the 19th century changed the rules of navigation and their lights still give seafarers in Granville a sense of security today.



L'Hôtel Picquelin, Granville

Despite the great conflicts of the 20th century, Granville's Haute-Ville has retained its authentic character and still has many reminders of the golden age of its economic and commercial past. The grand houses of former shipowning families, including the Hôtel Picquelin at 61 rue Saint Jean, are perfect examples.



Manoir du Mesnil de Bas, Bréhal

The 'Pierres à ciel ouvert' walking trail allows you to discover the little-known heritage in this area, while enjoying the hedged farmland through which the trail passes. The most surprising of these fragments of history is the Mesnil de Bas manor house, a superb granite structure set in an exceptional rural location.

The 'Granvillières'

The 'great discoveries' of the late 15th and early 16th centuries marked a turning point in Granville's economic and commercial history. Many sailors from Granville were among the first to explore what was then known as Newfoundland. This was a land of new conquests, as well as new activities linked to fishing.

In the 1520s, the first 'terre-neuvas' boats left Granville for the great cod fishing grounds. There were around fifteen of them by the end of the 16th century. The activity continued to develop until it reached its peak in the years leading up to the French Revolution, when around a hundred ships left the port of Granville each year to sail westwards. All this activity benefited the town's great shipowning families. The income from fishing in

Newfoundland, not to mention the wealth from privateering activities, enabled the Picquelins, the Le Pelleys and the Dry de la Turbotière to invest massively in property. Grand town houses began to appear in the streets of the Haute-Ville, and splendid country homes were simultaneously being built in the rural areas surrounding Granville.

Many families, such as the prominent merchants in Saint-Malo, wanted to enjoy the peace and quiet of the countryside. However, they also saw opportunities in agricultural production. The result was the 'Granvillières', places built so that the owners could rest and where they could also farm, many of which are still standing today. They are now sites of historic significance and symbolise the region's economic golden age.

The maritime history of Granville



1113

A statue of the Virgin Mary was found in the nets of a fisherman from Granville. Although this miraculous catch has never really been proven, this story does provide evidence of the **presence of fishermen on the Roque de Lihou as far back as the 12th century.**

The Years

1520-1530

The first fishing vessels for Newfoundland left Granville for the great cod fishing grounds. Driven by a spirit of adventure and exploration, the fishermen of Granville used their knowledge and experience to set out to conquer Newfoundland and its riches.

1532-1564

Granville's first harbour was built.

This major project was part of a wider architectural and economic revival initiated by Francis I following his coronation in 1515. It was the people of Granville themselves who approached the King, who granted them funds equivalent to 4,000 livres to build the harbour.

End of

16th century

Granville entered into the 'guerre des courses'. The first shipowner in the town to take part in these privateering activities was a certain Jehan Duhamel. In 1591, he obtained a letter of marque signed by the King authorising him to arm his ships in order to chase down enemy merchant vessels.

1691

Oyster fishing, a traditional activity in Granville, became regulated following a decree by the French government. As a result, there were tighter controls on fishing rights, fishing areas and selling prices. Prices suddenly soared, angering a poor population which depended on this activity for its livelihood and food.

1750

Work began on Granville's new harbour.

The crowning glory of this project was the great jetty, which despite several storms and conflicts, still stands today and still offers protection to seafarers from the ravages of the sea.

24 february 1815

The Chamber of Commerce was officially opened. As well as the better regulation of fishing activities, this new body would go on to play an active role in the town's industrial development. Its influence led to the construction of a wet dock in the harbour in 1833.



1828

Granville lighthouse came into service.

The first lighthouse to be built in the Channel, it provided a level of safety hitherto unknown to sailors from Granville sailing around the Roc. Its light, electrified since 1924, has a range of 23 nautical miles (43 km) and is one of the most powerful in France.

3 July 1870

Opening of the Paris-Granville railway line.

Seaside activities were already flourishing during this period (in fact, bathing regulations had been in place since 1837), but it was the arrival of a new section of the French population thanks to access to trains which would definitively complete Granville's transition from a cod stronghold to a seaside town.

7 February 1875

A 'GRRRRRRANDE CAVALCADE' was announced

on posters throughout Granville. This 'new' carnival had its roots in the 300-year-old tradition linked to the departure of fishermen to the shoals found off Newfoundland. The context, however, had changed completely, and so it was in a good-natured and satirical atmosphere that Granville celebrated the first carnival, which now has UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage status.

1933

The last fishing vessel bound for Newfoundland left Granville.

This voyage officially marked the end of an industry which, at the end of the 18th century, was the town's main source of income. In that same year, the Granville Yacht Club was founded, signalling a move towards a new approach to sailing which was dedicated to both leisure and competition.

1936

Marin-Marie left New York aboard his ship L'Arielle and set off on a 19-day Atlantic crossing. This was not the first time that this navigator and official painter to the French Navy had made the crossing solo.

Others had also made the journey before him. However, it was Marin-Marie who achieved the feat of making the first solo crossing aboard a motorboat!

1970

The Regional Nautical Centre in Granville opened its doors.

This ambitious project, which would continue to expand in the years to come, is proof of Granville's determination to embrace all forms of recreational boating. Another example of this type of development was the opening of the marina in 1975.

15 April 1990

The Granvillaise was launched.

This small flat-bottomed boat, a perfect replica of a 'bisquine' was built according to the design of the Rose-Marie, which itself dated from 1897. It revived the long tradition of oyster fishing, as well as the much more recent tradition of bisquine regattas.

2012

The return of a Newfoundland cod fishing vessel to Granville. Following 6 years of restoration, the Marité returned to Granville, its new home port. This superb three-masted ship is the last French 'Terre-neuvier' and is just over a hundred years old.

Young deckhand, we've got a mission for you! Accompanied by a former sailor come corsair, you'll be wandering around the narrow streets of the Haute Ville in search of a mysterious statue that was built in tribute to the greatest captain that Granville has ever known.

As you stroll along the docks of France's leading shellfish port, you'll see how the fishing practices and techniques have changed over the centuries, and how fishermen today try to respect local biodiversity wherever possible.

● Polo, tell us about the fishing port

What sort of fishing techniques are there in Granville today? What technique is used to catch lobsters in Chausey? And above all, what is it that causes the sea to come in and go out over and over, every day without fail? You'll find all the answers to these questions at Granville fishing port.

● A walk around the Havre de la Vanlée

The Havre de la Vanlée is a one of the Destination's unmissable natural areas and what makes this place really special is the sheer diversity of biodiversity there. As you explore the area, you'll see some of the many species that live there, and how human activity has shaped this land over time.

● Donville at dawn

Since the 1920s, Donville-les-Bains has been known for the quality of sea bathing there and the charming seaside houses. But it is also hiding another past that is also worth a mention, and close to 800 years of history will be revealed to you throughout your visit.

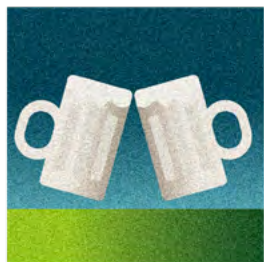
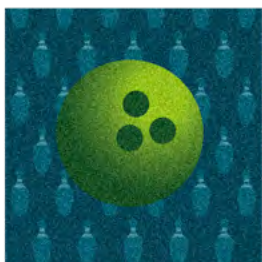
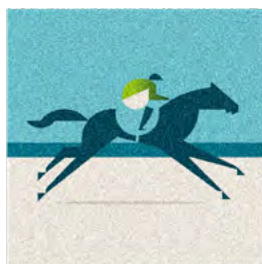
